Regent is a private, Christian interdenominational, College Preparatory school offering a rigorous classical and Christian education, firmly grounded in the liberal arts. True to the classical model, students are instructed through the stages of Trivium (Grammar, Logic, Rhetoric).

Established in 2000 with 60 students, Regent now serves over 500 students in Pre-K through 12. The campus houses a 900 seat auditorium, a 3.2 million dollar gymnasium, and a new School of Rhetoric building.

Regent is accredited by the Association of Classical and Christian Schools (ACCS) and is a member of the Oklahoma Private School Accreditation Commission (OPSAC), the Educational Records Bureau (ERB), and the Oklahoma Secondary School Activities Association (OSSAA).

Distinctives

CLASS SIZE In all core subjects, classes are comprised of no more than 16 students. This facilitates discussion, engagement, and interaction with instructors and fellow students.

HUMANITIES CORE Literature and history classes are integrated by following a chronological study of history, ranging from Classical Antiquity to Modernity. Students interact with primary sources in both humanities classes.

WRITING INTENSIVE Throughout the curriculum students will offer critical, written response to a primary text, a great idea, a scientific theory, or even a mathematical theorem. This process of composition and revision cultivates skills of criticism and analysis and also aids the students in crafting constructive solutions. Students learn to ask the “why?” questions, laying a foundation for engaging with many of the human challenges we face today.

SENIOR THESIS Seniors are required to compose and deliver a lengthy argument based on original research. They must then defend the thesis before a panel of faculty judges. Both the presentation and defense are open to the public.

FACULTY 15 of the 24 faculty members hold advanced degrees (MA, MS, JD, PhD, EdD). Student faculty ratio is 16:1.

COMMUNITY SERVICE Through Regent's affiliation with **National Beta Club**, as well as individual pursuits, students average over 100 service hours each throughout their tenure in high school.
